HOT ON THE HEELS of a banner year for British Columbia's home building industry, the 13th Annual Georgie Awards was truly a gala celebration. With more than 400 entries - an astonishing 38% increase over last year competition was stiff. Judges were bombarded with marketing statements, thick packages of blueprints, and over 2,500 photographs. But for the people who gathered at the Westin Bayshore on February 18th, the evening was an affirmation of BC's success and renewed vibrancy.

This year there was no run-away winner, no single company or project that swept the awards. Still, the evening was hardly without its share of surprises. One category, Best Print Advertisement, resulted in a tie between Concert Real Estate and Anthem Properties. But the biggest surprise of the evening was the announcement of a new category for Best Single Family Home Valued over \$5,000,000. Unique in Georgie history, the judges felt Vision Pacific's project, The Grove, was simply too outstanding to be judged fairly in the category of Best Single Family Home Valued over \$1,000,000 as it was submitted. The new category will become a regular part of the awards in future years.

The coveted Grand Georgies were awarded to some of the industries oldest and newest members. Adera Developments was once again acknowledged as Best Home Builder in BC (Large Volume) while Homescape Building & Design took Best Home Builder in BC (Small Volume).
